Good Behaviour

Our approach to behaviour is based on positivity and restorative practice. Every class in school uses the same effective behaviour system. The children all have their photograph on the chart and start each day on green.

The chart to the right indicates the colours as well as the corresponding behaviours and consequences.

Our Attendance

Attendance really matters to us here at Forest of Galtres Anglican Methodist Primary School. We expect children to aim for **100% attendance** at school.

However, we also understand that there are times when a child will be ill and may be absent or that there may be legitimate reasons for absence. The national average for attendance is 96%, the equivalent of missing around 8 days over a year, and all children should aim to have this as a minimum for attendance.

We have a number of rewards for attendance such as postcards, class competitions with trophies and extra playtimes! Our current attendance is celebrated on Twitter and within our newsletters.

Our whole-school attendance target is at least 96%.

After School Club

After School club runs every night and is available from 3.30pm until 5.30pm.

A healthy snack and drink is available.

Sessions need to be booked and paid for in advance on ParentPay.

The cost is £7.50.

There are also a range of after school extra-curricular clubs throughout the week.
